Does My Project Require an IRB Application?

You are required to submit a formal application if your proposed study meets both of these conditions: It constitutes research and is conducted on human subjects. The quiz below is designed to determine if your study meets both criteria. If it does, a formal application is required before research begins. The IRB cannot approve research after it has been done.

Part A: Does my study constitute research?

According to the Code of Federal Regulations, research means a systematic investigation, including research development, testing and evaluation, designed to develop or contribute to generalizable knowledge [45 CFR 46.102(d)].

Answer **yes** or **no** to the following questions:

- Do you expect or intend to publish the results of your study?
- Do you expect or intend to **present** the results of your study at a conference?
- Are you doing this project as part of your Senior Research Project?

If your answer was **no** to all questions, your study is not considered research. A formal application is waived and you are free to begin your study. If your answer was **yes** for any of the questions, your study is considered research. Continue to Part B.

Part B: Is my study considered research on human subjects?

Answer **yes** or **no** to the following questions:

- Will people themselves be the **subjects** of study?*
- Will the study involve interacting with living people?
- Will you gather information that would ordinarily be **private** (e.g. personal beliefs)?
- Will you observe behavior in a context where the subjects would reasonably expect privacy (e.g. their homes)?

*Interviewing your physics professor to learn about black holes does not count, since then the subject of your research is black holes; interviewing the same professor to learn about his/her values, experiences or behavior, however, IS research on human subjects.

If your answer was **no** to all questions, your study is not considered to be on human subjects. Formal application is waived and you are free to begin your study. If your answer was **yes** for question 1 **and** one or more of the questions 2, 3 or 4, your study is considered to be on human subjects.

If your study is indeed research on human subjects, you must submit a formal application. Proceed to our application process.

If you are still not sure whether or not your study is considered research on human subjects, visit the Office for Human Research Protections (OHRP) within the Department of Health & Human Services (DHHS) to see detailed explanations of what does and what doesn't constitute research on human subjects under the federal regulations.
