

On Feb. 7, the Games of the XXII province. And there have been a few hiccoughs on the way there.

The first sign that things might not quite be up to snuff came a few days before the opening ceremonies, when reporters arriving in the Russian coastal town began sending tweets referencing the state of their hotels.

Stacy St. Clair, The Chicago Tribune's reporter covering the games in Sochi, tweeted the news that hotels were without running water; and that if restored – front desk clerks were urging people not to use it on their faces as "it contains something very



Last Friday, Valentine's Day, Heather Balas and the Career Development Center hosted a special etiquette diner. While the dinner included components of traditional etiquette dinners messy foods, tips for eating, and interacting with other students - it also included a new element: wine.


