The Thiel College Alumni Association is proud of the ways in which Thiel alumni have contributed to their professions, their communities and their alma mater. The awards given each year at Homecoming single out those alumni who have distinguished themselves in three ways:

Distinguished Alumni are nominated by the Thiel community and approved for recognition by the Alumni Association Board of Directors for outstanding contributions to their professions.

Service to Thiel award winners are nominated by the Thiel community and approved for recognition by the Alumni Association Board of Directors for their loyalty, service and devotion to Thiel College.

Young Alumni award winners must have received their degree from Thiel College within the past 10 years. They are nominated by the Thiel community and approved by the Alumni Association Board of Directors for their potential for future accomplishments in their professions and in their service to the College.

A list of those who have received these awards in the past 15 years is included at the end of this program.

Arthur Wetzel, Ph.D. '73



Arthur Wetzel, Ph.D. '73 was born in Oil City, Pa. and grew up in Wentling Corners farm country near Knox, Pa. He developed a lifelong interest in science, math, and technology at an early age. He was influenced by his grandfather and encouraged by his parents. He was always experimenting and building electronic and optical devices, including telescopes, ham radio equipment, and a TV. He became an Eagle Scout in 1966 and was a founding member of a BSA Explorer post.

He continued his hobbies of astronomy and photography as a chemistry major at Thiel. He also began work in computing when Thiel got its first computer in 1974.

After Thiel, he entered the University of Pittsburgh Interdisciplinary Department Doctoral program in information science. At Pitt, he began as a teaching assistant and progressed to assistant professor. An important part of his Pitt work was setting up departmental computing systems with Bell Labs' UNIX.

At Pitt, he met graduate student **Rose Barbuto**, and they married in 1980. After his Ph.D. dissertation defense on genetic algorithms, the couple moved to New Jersey. Wetzel joined Bell Telephone Laboratories technical staff in Holmdel, N.J. With the breakup of the Bell System, he became a consulting engineer at Pixel Computer in Massachusetts. He became Vice President of R&D for xePIX Incorporated in Nashua, N.H. The couple's two children, **Nathaniel Wetzel** and **Annamarie Grand**, were born in Massachusetts in 1984 and 1987.

Later in 1987, the family returned to Pittsburgh and Wetzel began working in the computing systems group at Carnegie Mellon and teaching at Pitt. While continuing to teach, Wetzel also joined the Pittsburgh Supercomputing Center (PSC)

in 1995 and has focused on biomedical image applications. He has contributed to pathology diagnostics through content-based image retrieval and was the lead on patents for automated microscopic pathology imaging.

Recently, he has collaborated on large-scale electron microscopy projects and traveled to institutions across the U.S. and to Germany. He is working on image projects at the PSC and has collaborations with the University of Texas and Salk Institute developing techniques for neural circuit reconstruction from electron microscopy.

He and his wife enjoy spending time with their nearby grandchildren **Teagan** and **Waylon**.

Philip Joyce, Ph.D. '78



Philip Joyce, Ph.D. '78 was a history major studying under the dedicated mentorship of Professor of History Emeritus Bob Olson, Ph.D. '60 H'09. Joyce was a member of Phi Theta Phi fraternity while at Thiel, in addition to serving as the official scorer for the Thiel men's basketball team and participating in intramural sports. Joyce got a master's degree in public administration from Pennsylvania State University and a Ph.D. in public administration from the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs, Syracuse University.

His career has included both stints in government service and as a faculty member at various universities. Joyce spent four years with the Illinois Bureau of the Budget, three years with the Illinois Department of Corrections, and five years with the United States Congressional Budget Office (CBO). He is a Professor of Public Policy in the University of Maryland's School of Public Policy. Joyce has also been on the faculty of The George Washington University, Syracuse University, and the University of Kentucky.

Joyce has written three books and more than 50 journal articles and other publications. He is a past editor of the journal Public Budgeting and Finance, is a past president of the American Association and Budget and Program Analysis and is a past chair of the American Society for Public Administration's (ASPA) Center on Accountability and Performance (CAP).

Joyce is a Fellow of the National Academy of Public Administration. In 1992, he received the CBO Director's Award for Distinguished Service. He is the recipient of several national awards, including the Aaron Wildavsky Award for lifetime scholarship in public budgeting and finance (2012) and the Paul Posner Career Legacy Award from George Mason University (2021). Joyce has testified 14 times before the U.S. Congress on budget process reform issues. He has consulted internationally, both as an individual and for the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank. This consulting work has taken him to Bulgaria, Canada, Chile, China, Guyana, Korea, Kuwait, Latvia, Lithuania, Mexico, and Slovenia.

Joyce has been happily married for 35 years and has three wonderful grown children. He remains in touch with a lot of his friends from Thiel days, especially his Phi brothers, many of whom have been connecting via Zoom at least monthly since the beginning of the pandemic.

Melissa (Eagon) Oakes '03



Melissa (Eagon) Oakes' 03 graduated from Thiel College with a B.A. in business administration & accounting. She earned her CPA (Certified Public Accountant) in 2007 and her CFE (Certified Fraud Examiner) in 2008. She earned her Master of Business Administration in 2012 at Clarion University (now Penn West).

Oakes was a healthcare audit supervisor when she left Carbis Walker, LLP in 2008 and worked at MVS Saegertown as a cost accountant supervisor until 2010 when she joined Thiel College as a professor in the Arthur McGonigal Department of Business Administration and Accounting.

Oakes received, through faculty nomination, the Faculty Service Award at Thiel's Founders Day, Lambda Sigma's Professor of the Month three times (sophomore student society), and the National Society of Leadership and Success Service and Leadership Awards, both through student nomination. She has served as chair of the Promotion & Tenure Committee and as a member of the Faculty Executive Committee. She is the chair of the Arthur McGonigal Department of Business Administration and Accounting Department and a member of the Dietrich Honors Council.

Through the Pennsylvania Institute of Certified Public Accountants, she's served on the High School and CPA Exam Scholarship Committee, Schools and Colleges Committee, and the Emerging CPA's Committee, and reached the PICPA's Young Leader Award.

She was recently named a trustee to the George Wright Fund, which provides interest-free student loans.

Melissa lives in Sandy Lake, Pa. with her husband, **Justin**, and goldendoodles, Izzy and Skye. In her spare time, she enjoys boating, running, golfing (a new-found hobby) and traveling with friends.

Anna (Pischera) Reisel, Ph.D.'06



Anna (Pischera) Reinsel, Ph.D. 'o6 graduated from Thiel College with degrees in environmental chemistry and chemistry with American Chemical Society certification. She received her Ph.D. in analytical chemistry from the University of Akron. She has been a professor and chair of the environmental science department at Thiel since 2011. She has taught a variety of classes, including courses in the honors, environmental science, chemistry, geology,

environmental safety management and interdisciplinary programs.

Reinel's favorite thing about teaching at Thiel is her students. She is proud of the Envirocats, who she described as "amazing." Reinsel said she has been lucky to advise and mentor so many hardworking Thiel students who have become successful alumni. Under her leadership, the environmental science department has added an environmental safety management program that has brought with it "many awesome students." One of her passions is traveling with students. She has led multiple study abroad/away experiences with Thiel students including a Hawaii Ecology program this May.

Reinsel's service to the College, in addition to teaching, advising and mentoring students and leading the environmental science department, includes serving on a number of committees. This has included many search committees for administrators and faculty members to join the Thiel community. She is the Assistant Faculty Marshall and is a member of the Faculty Executive Committee.

James Frank'88 came to Thiel from Beaver, Pa. He is the son of Curtis and Sally Frank.
