

ADVISING NOTES FOR DHI STUDENTS

- I. The DHI has its own Core courses. DHI students take these instead of the regular Core.
- a. For either B.A. or B.S., DHI students must complete the following with a grade of C- or higher (30-31 credits); usually in this sequence:
 - Freshman Fall**
 - HONS 109 Becoming Human: Love, Power, and Justice
 - HONS 113 Communicating Effectively: Grammar, Logic, and Rhetoric
 - Freshman Spring**
 - HONS 114 Creating Culture: Ancient, Medieval, Modern
 - HONS 128 Interpreting Scriptures: Jewish, Christian, Islamic
 - Sophomore Fall:**
 - HONS 126 Composing Contextually: Enlightenment, Romanticism, Postmodernism
 - Sophomore Spring:**
 - HONS 127 Emerging Reality: Universe, Life, Mind
 - HONS 137 Emerging Reality Lab (Science Majors Exempt)
 - Junior Fall:**
 - HONS 250 Global Perspectives (**replaces** HONS 230 Understanding Globalization)
 - Junior Spring:**
 - HONS 240 Appreciating Creativity: Artistic, Scientific, Societal
 - Senior Fall:**
 - HONS 340 Contributing Culturally: Researching, Creating, Presenting
 - Plus: 1 Honors Elective (approved by the class professor and the DHI Director)**
 - Pre-approved options Fall 2018: Art 122, 140, 232. Eng 495, Literature of World Leaders. Hist 331, Nineteenth Century Europe. Inds 155, Ethical Leadership. Phil 387 Medical Ethics. Phil 337 Social and Political Philosophy. Any SEMS 400 course**
 - b. **All DHI students must register for the 0 credit HONS 100 course.**
 - c. **Mathematics competency:** placement test at the pre-calculus level, or a C grade or higher in math at or above MATH 142. For the B.A., Statistics for the Social Sciences (PSY 233) is satisfactory. For the B.S., MATH 142 or a Calculus course is required.
 - d. **Foreign language competency:** Two semesters of introductory language work, achieving a C or above, OR one semester of intermediate language work. Exemption through exam allowed.
 - e. **Senior Research Project:** Completed and presented before graduation, usually at the Student Research Symposium. Project must be considered satisfactory to three faculty members: the project's faculty advisor, the DHI Director, and project's reader. Projects are developed within Honors 240, and 340 guides the student's project to completion.
 - f. DHI students are **NOT** required to satisfy the **Practicum** or take the two credit **HPED Physical Well-Being** course.
- II. **DHI membership requires a 3.0 semester to semester and cumulatively.** A student falling below 3.0 for a semester is placed on probation. If a second semester falls below 3.0, that person is dismissed, barring any appeal. A student below a 2.0 at any time is subject to dismissal. A cumulative 3.0 is required by the end of the junior year to enter the senior year as a DHI member.
