

The DHI Curriculum

The standard DHI Curriculum consists of four courses (12 credit hours) taken during the first year, two courses (6 credit hours for science majors and 7 credit hours for non-science majors because their course includes a one credit hour lab) taken during the second year, two courses (6 credit hours) taken during the third year, and one course (3 credit hours) taken during the fourth year. DHI students also are to take at least one elective course (3 credit hours) during years two, three, or four. This amounts to ten Honors courses for a total of 30 or 31 credit hours, which is about 25 percent of the 124 credit hours required for graduation. In addition, completion and presentation of the Honors Thesis in the senior year is required, in conjunction with the Honors 340 course, Contributing Culturally.
