Louis and Barbara Thiel Distinguished Service Award

John '71 and Nancy (Gibson) Hauser '75



John and Nancy Gibson Hauser might have followed different paths to and from Thiel College, but they found each other through their connection to the College and have been walking the same path as committed philanthropists, giving their time and resources to many organizations that serve Greenville and the region, since they married in June 2011. They both actively participate in the Thiel community, attend and support Thiel College events, and have been influential in the life of the institution's alumni network. They met as students and began a romantic relationship 35 years later.

Nancy (Gibson) Hauser graduated from Thiel College in 1975 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education and history. She went on to receive a Master of Education degree from Youngstown State University. Retired after 35 years as an elementary teacher in the Ohio Beaver Local school district, she is an advocate for the College and its students. She continues lasting friendships with the faculty, administration, Board of Trustees, students and staff, and maintains close fellowship with Chi Omega—the sorority she joined at Thiel—and actively participates with the Youngstown Area Chi Omega Alumnae chapter, having served as their secretary and president. She is also an energetic participant at her church, the First Presbyterian Church of Youngstown, where she serves on the board of deacons and the mission interpretation committee.

John Hauser graduated from Thiel College in 1971 with a degree in psychology. As a student, he joined the Phi Theta Phi fraternity and continues to participate in fraternity events to this day.

Hauser worked at Thiel from 1971-1986 and served as director of admissions from 1975-1980, director of admissions and financial aid from 1980-1982, and director of alumni affairs from 1982-1986. He served as director of development for the University of Pittsburgh's College of Arts and Sciences from 1986-1988. In 1988, Hauser became the executive director of development at Franklin College in Franklin, Ind. He helped Franklin raise over \$18 million from 1988-1996 and was promoted to Franklin's vice president for development and public affairs in May 1994. He was named Thiel College's executive director of development in 1996 and has served as Thiel College's archivist since his retirement in 2007. Hauser earned his Master of Education degree from the University of Pittsburgh in 1985. He won the Lifetime Service Award of the Council for Advancement and Support of Education in 2007.

The Louis and Barbara Thiel Distinguished Service Award is presented annually to community members who demonstrate exemplary character, continuity of leadership and long-term service to Greenville and its environs. The recipients must demonstrate a commitment to the common good above private interests. The award is named after Louis and Barbara Thiel, whose generosity made the founding of Thiel College possible in 1866. The Thiels dedicated themselves to the welfare of others. The German couple immigrated to western Pennsylvania in the 1840s, and as their work was blessed with success, they faithfully served family, community, and church.

Distinguished Professor of the Year

Matthew R. Morgan, Ph.D.

Professor of Philosophy, Director of the Dietrich Honors Institute



Matthew R. Morgan, Ph.D. has become an integral part of the Thiel College faculty since arriving at Thiel in 2006 as a member of the Department of Philosophy, demonstrating a dedication and commitment to the College, his colleagues and Thiel's students.

Most recently, Morgan began as the director of the Dietrich Honors Institute. He has also been the coordinator for the study abroad program and chair of the Humanities Caucus.

His work has included terms on the Institutional Planning and Budgeting, Curriculum Study and Strategic Planning committees, the Executive Committee and the Community Medical Ethics Project.

He was given the Rowley Award for Teaching Excellence in 2015 and the Distinguished Service Award from Thiel College in 2012. He won the André Schuwer Essay Award in 2003, for "Husserl, Wittgenstein, and the Vienna Circle."

Morgan holds a bachelor's degree from California State University-Northridge and master's and doctoral degrees from Duquesne University. Prior to Thiel, he taught at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, Chatham College, Washington & Jefferson College, Duquesne University and Allegheny College.

A native of Los Angeles, Calif., he lives in Greenville, Pa. He is married to Julie and they have a son, Zachary.

Distinguished Adjunct

Rebecca M. Hecking

Adjunct Professor of Biology, Math and Computer science



Rebecca M. Hecking teaches math, biology and computer science classes, earning praise as a compassionate and patient instructor.

She is the author of “The Sustainable Soul: Eco-Spiritual Reflections and Practices,” which was released in 2009 and “The Thoughtful Caregiver: Surviving, Thriving and Growing in Spirit as You Care for Your Elderly Parent,” which was released in November 2016.

She is married to Thiel College Professor of Physics Patrick Hecking, Ph.D., and lives in Greenville. She and Patrick have three adult children, Steven (24); Matthew (22) and Julia (20).

Hecking graduated from Westminster College with a Bachelor of Science degree in chemistry in 1988. She has a master’s degree in cultural studies and equity studies from Athabasca University in Alberta, Canada (2007).

Distinguished Scholar

Marie C. Courtemanche, Ph.D.

Assistant Professor of Political Science, Department Chair



Since she began teaching at Thiel College in 2014, Marie Courtemanche, Ph.D., has established herself as an eminent researcher and publisher of political science scholarship.

Topics she enjoys teaching include American government, voters and elections, mass media and American politics, public opinion, the legislative process, and the politics of immigration. She researches political behavior, self-interest, identity, race and ethnicity, immigration, and mass communication.

Last year, Courtemanche published a paper entitled, “Religious Social Identity, Religious Belief and Anti-Immigration Sentiment” in the *American Political Science Review*. This paper led to an article she co-authored for the *Washington Post* opinion section. This summer, she won an award from the Greenville Neuromodulation Center Faculty/Student Research

Institute to study the differential effects of scandals on male and female politicians.

Courtemanche received a bachelor’s degree in political science and economics from the University of New Hampshire in 2001 and a master’s degree and doctorate in political science from Stony Brook University in 2006 and 2010.

She resides in Sharpsville, Pa., and enjoys traveling, cooking, baking and hiking.

Distinguished Service

Patrick C. Hecking, Ph.D.

Professor of Physics, Department Chair



Patrick C. Hecking, Ph.D., has served as a professor for nearly 30 years at Thiel College. In his time, he has taught and mentored undergraduate research on a wide variety of topics, including sunspot tracing; thermal imaging on thin films; fluidyne engines; model trebuchet performance; alternative energy devices (solar panels, small wind and water wheels); biofuels; radar gun measurements of flying objects; visible light and IR transmission of glass windows and electric skin resistance.

In addition to his teaching and advising roles, Hecking has served on many committees including the promotion and tenure committee and the curriculum study committee, where he was recently reelected as chair. In addition, he has attended every Hodge Institute.

Hecking, and his wife, Rebecca, who is an adjunct professor at Thiel College, live in Greenville, Pa. and have three children, Steven (24); Matthew (22) and Julia (20). He enjoys traveling, photography, scuba diving, windsurfing, mountaineering and skiing. He took time off in 1979-1980 for an eight-month backpacking trip around the world in Japan, southeast Asia, Australia and New Zealand.

He graduated with a Bachelor of Science in physics from the University of Cologne in 1969. He earned his master's in physics and doctorate in theoretical physics from the University of Erlangen in Erlangen, Germany.

Distinguished Teacher

Curtis L. Thompson, Ph.D.

Professor of Religion and founding director of the Dietrich Honors Institute



Curtis L. Thompson, Ph.D. is recognized as more than a professor. One of his students called him a “role model, mentor and motivator” and said he is less concerned with his students getting a 4.0 and more focused on helping them become human.

Thompson came to Thiel College to become part of the Religion Department in 1983. He earned a Bachelor of Arts in Chemistry from Concordia College in Moorhead, Minn. in 1969, a Master of Divinity from Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minn. in 1974, a Master of Arts in Religion from the University of Chicago in 1979, and a Ph.D. in Theology from the University of Chicago in 1985. He served as the pastor of St. Paul American Lutheran Church in inner-city Minneapolis from 1974 to 1978.

At Thiel, Thompson has contributed to several College-wide curricular initiatives and has been a part of various teaching teams. Thompson was named Professor of the Year in 1992, 2002 and 2015. He was the director of the Dietrich Honors Institute since its inception in 2012 until January 2017 and is retiring from Thiel College at the end of the spring 2017 semester.

Thompson and his wife, Kathy, live in Greenville. They have four children—Sarah (46), Josh (45), Aaron (34), and Joran (32)—and two grandsons, Soren and Brekken. They are members of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, where they sing in the choir. He also serves on the Salvation Army Board of Directors.

“I have thoroughly enjoyed being able to spend time with and learn from young people who are full of life and ready to probe more deeply into the theoretical and practical dimensions of reality,” Thompson said. “I appreciate all those who have been willing to connect with me so that we could together creatively think and act our way into new ideas and experiences. My time as a teacher over the last 34 years leaves me hopeful for the future because of all the terrific folks who are making their way into the world with a passion to learn and love.”
