Thiel College competes in Intercollegiate Horse Show Association (IHSA) events. IHSA competitions are unique events because they provide horses and equipment at competition venues. Competitors can ride Western, Hunt Seat, Jumping or all three.

Lessons

Instructors provide both ground and mounted lessons dependent on the rider's ability level. Ground instruction teaches safe horse handling and horse care. Mounted instruction teaches a balanced riding position and proper use of aids to communicate with the horse.


Lessons are held at facilities off campus. Riders take lessons in groups and Thiel provides transportation to competitions. The barns where lessons take place are outfitted with saddles, bridles, grooming equipment, helmets and horses for students to use.
