Excel Opportunities Program highlights

- Learn to articulate your individual learning strengths and challenges.
- Identify numerous valuable college resources and accommodations that are available to you.



- Experience an introductory college-level class.
- Apply organizational skills needed to succeed in college and identify potential problem habits and behaviors that might occur during the first year.
- Consider taking a lighter first semester credit load as you transition to college.
- Partner with an academic coach who will continue to guide and monitor your progress and outcomes.

On average, students who complete Excel

- Finish the fall semester up to one full letter grade higher.
- Earn as much as 10 credit hours more by the end of their first year.
- Are 18% more likely to retain into their sophomore year.


