Thiel College discloses that successful completion of the **Master of Science in Speech-Language Pathology program** meets the graduate-level education requirements for licensure eligibility as a speech-language pathologist in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. The licensure disclosures pertain to professional speech-language pathologist licensure in each state. Please be aware that some states require a separate credential to practice in the school system which may have additional requirements. If a state Department of Education requires a separate credential to practice in the school system, you must obtain that credential to practice in schools. It is the student's responsibility to determine what is required to obtain the credential to work in the school system. It is the student's responsibility to remain up to date on all state licensure requirements.

Please be advised that licensure-related laws and regulations may change at any time, so always check with the state licensure agency where you plan to seek employment for the most up-to-date information.
