- The average **Compensation and Benefits Manager** salary in Pittsburgh is **\$133,780** running a company's compensation and benefits program.*
- The average **Human Resources Specialists** salary in Pittsburgh typically falls between **\$69,011** and **\$84,539**. Recruiting, screening, interviewing and placing workers are all part of the HR Specialists responsibilities.*
- **Labor Relations Specialists** in Pittsburgh earn an average annual salary of **\$74,219**. interpret and administrate labor contracts for issues such as wages, healthcare, pensions and union and management practices.*
- **Training and Development Specialists** earn, in Pittsburgh, a median salary of **\$73,481** planning and administering programs that improve employees' skill and knowledge.*
- **Executive Search Associates** in Pittsburgh earn a median salary of **\$46,431** working with companies and individuals to find and place executives in job openings.*
