Job Outlook

Employment for nutritionists and dietitians is projected to grow **6% through 2034**, faster than the national average (*U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics*).

The median annual wage for professionals in nutrition and dietetics is more than **\$69,000**, with opportunities to increase earnings through specialization, certifications, or advanced degrees.
